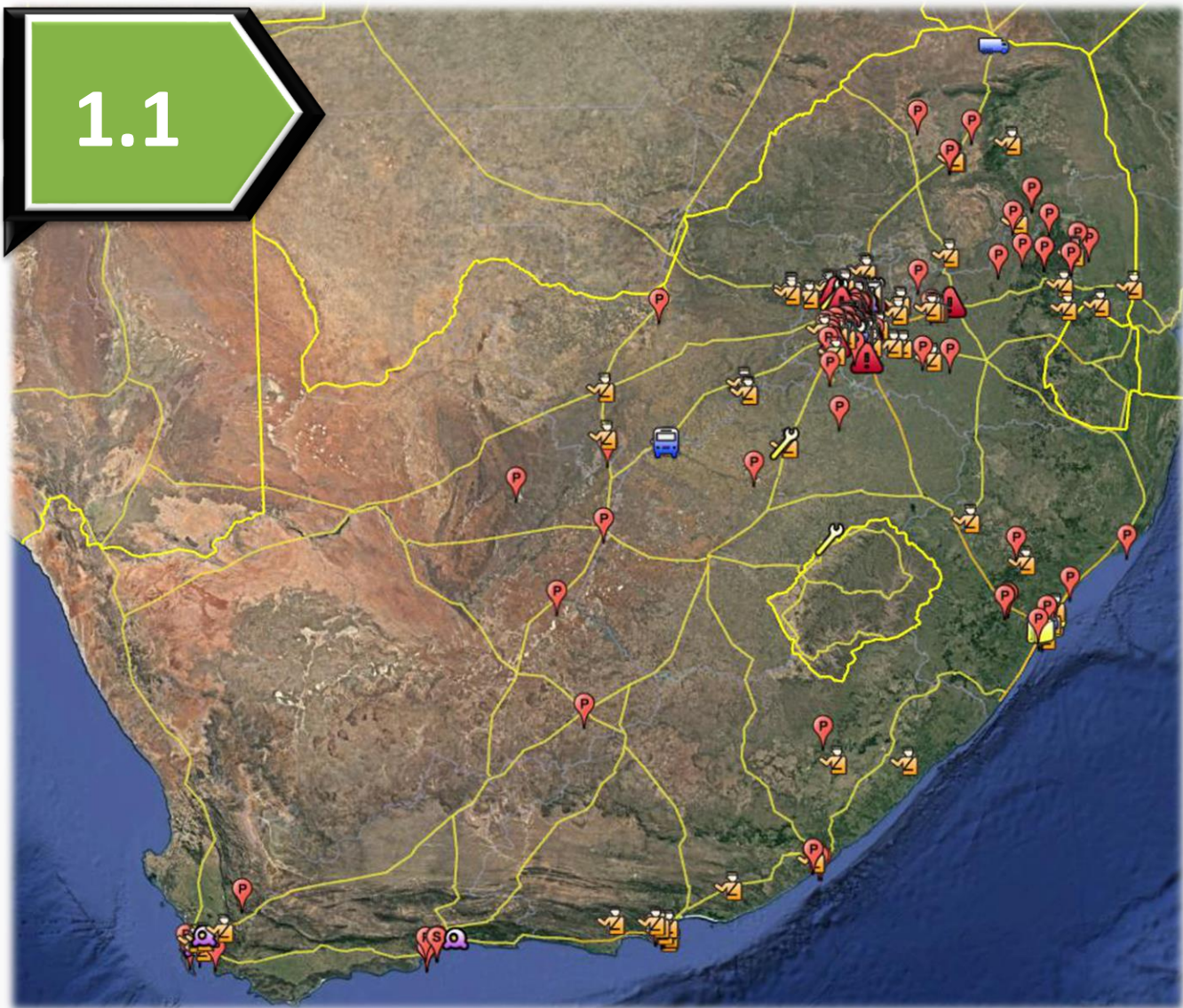

Service delivery related protest action anticipated in Enoch Mgijima Local Municipality (Eastern Cape) during July/August 2018

Grievances
Electricity network failures/electricity disruptions, uncollected refuse and sewage, unemployment, inadequate road infrastructure, insufficient traffic control measures and inadequate water supply

High-risk areas
Enoch Mgijima Local Municipal Office (Queenstown Central) and Informal settlements located in Hofmeyr, Queenstown, Molteno, Tarkastad and Whittlesea

Risks
Clashes between demonstrators and police, barricading roads (R61, R344, R390, R391 and N6), arson and malicious damage to property (setting municipal buildings alight)

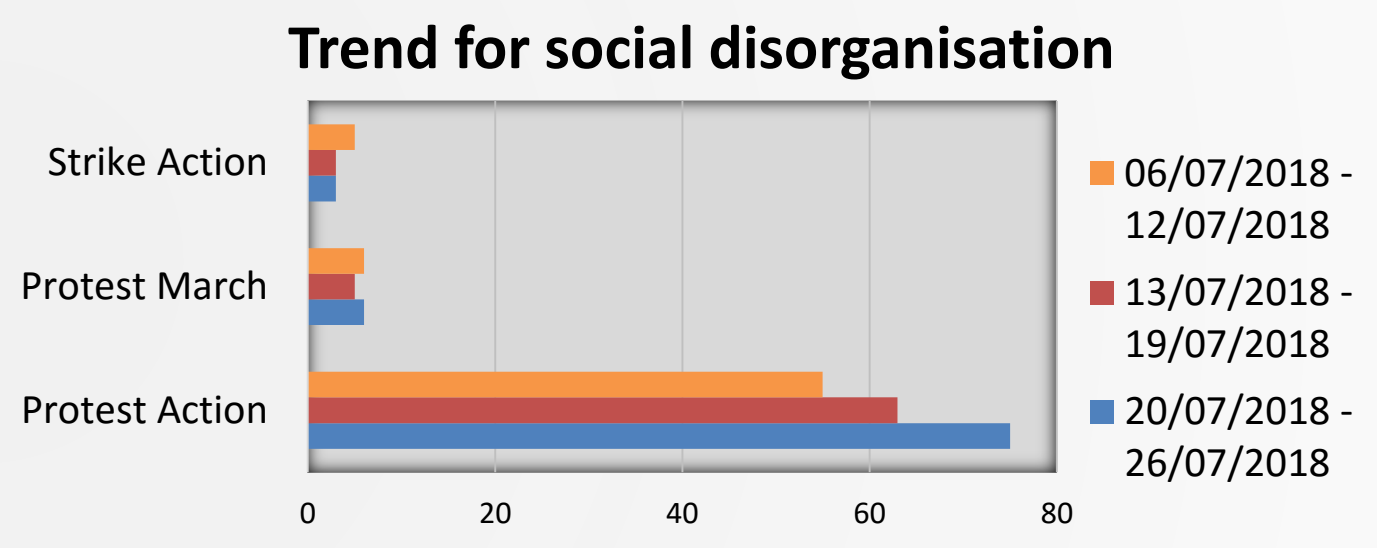
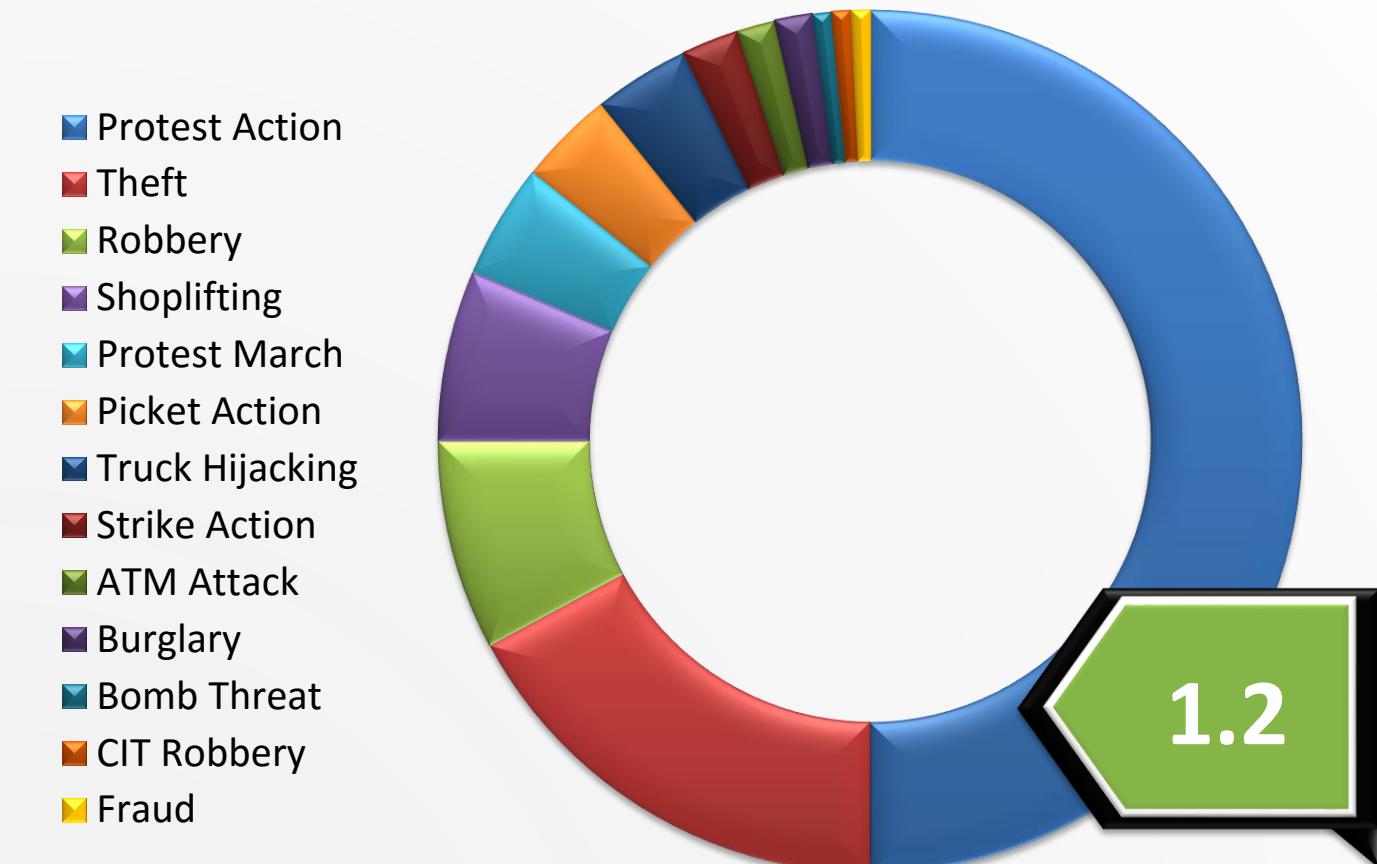

End location: National Treasury of South Africa

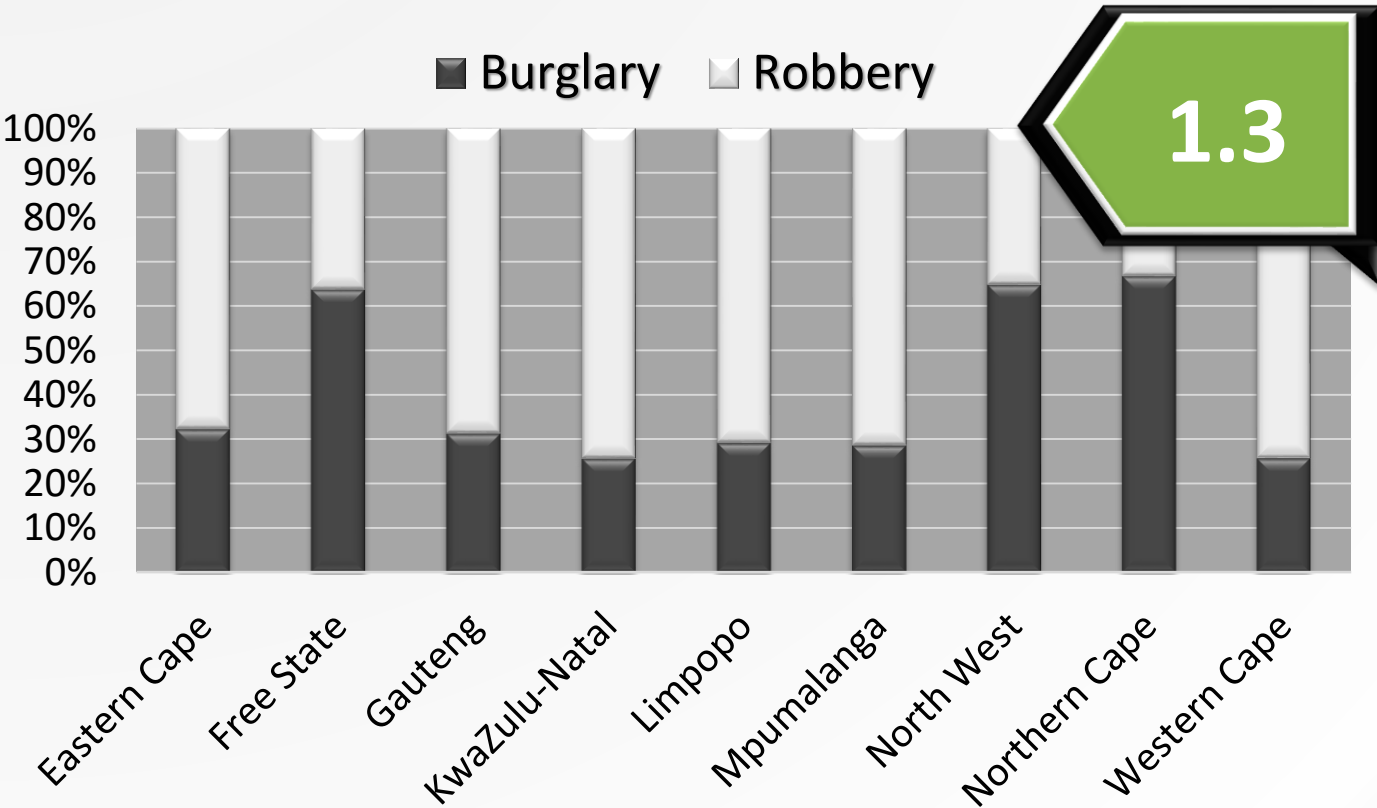
To demand that fuel levies be reduced by 20%, as well as that the Road Accident Fund (RAF) be placed under administration to reduce corruption and improve management

Risks during demonstration: Heavy foot traffic, loitering and intimidation

Illegal land occupations anticipated in several provinces during July/August 2018

Attempts at illegal land occupations could lead to the removal of structures by the police/Red Ants, which increases the risk for protest action

High-risk areas for illegal land occupations/protest action:

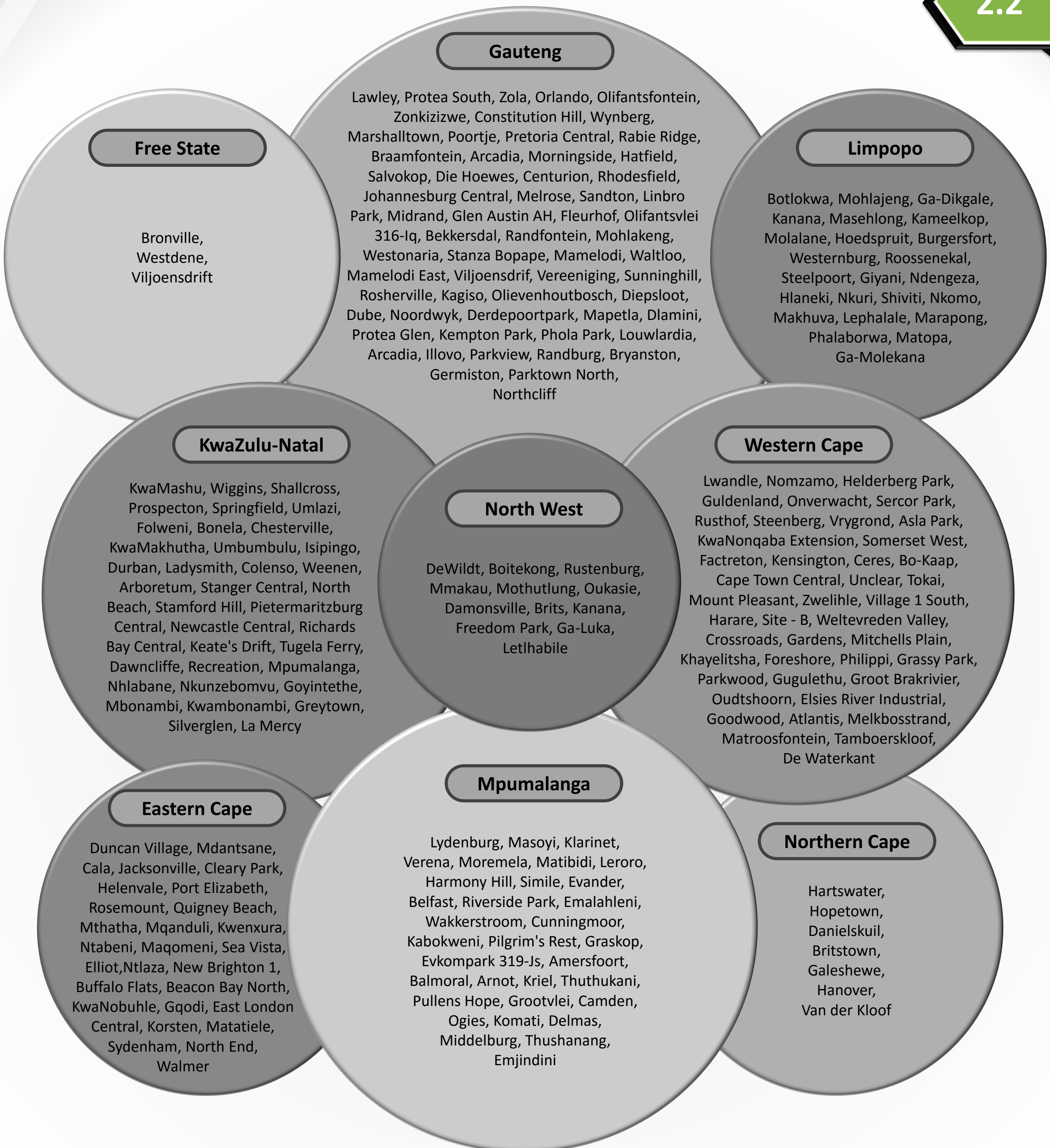
- KwaZulu-Natal: Recreation
- Gauteng: Fleurhof, Olifantsfontein
- Mpumalanga: Kabokweni
- Western Cape: Vrygrond, Bo-Kaap, Dunoon

Risks: Violent clashes between occupiers and authorities, arson, malicious damage to property and barricading of roads

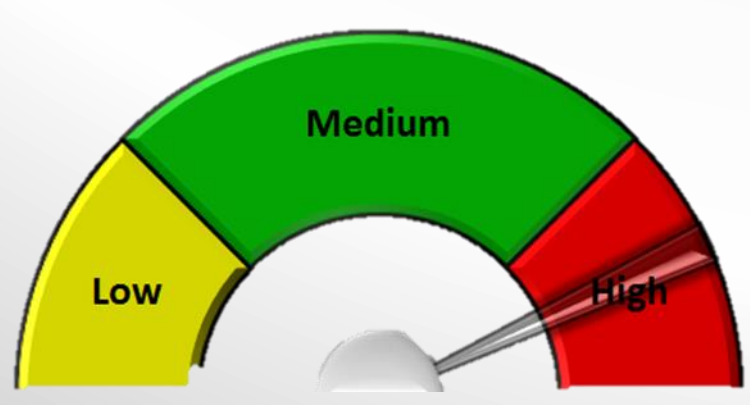

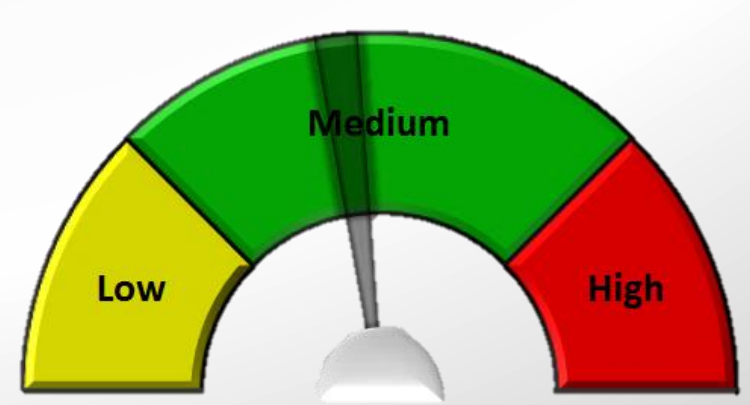
